



## ***St. Louis Area Physics Teachers 25<sup>th</sup> Annual High School Physics Contest 2010 Contest Results***

On Saturday, May 1, 2010, the St. Louis Section of the American Association of Physics Teachers hosted the 25<sup>th</sup> edition of the St. Louis Area Physics Teachers High School Physics Contest. The contest was hosted by Southwestern Illinois College in Belleville, under the direction of SLAPT member Frank Cange.

Sixty students from seven high schools participated in this year's contest. The test period was 2 hours for both a Mechanics Division, a 100-question test dealing with only mechanics topics, and a Senior Division, a 50-question test that included questions from mechanics, fluids, thermodynamics, electricity and magnetism, and optics. Awards were given in each division for first through fourth place for individuals, as well as honorable mention awards for the next highest 20% of the scores. Team awards were given in both divisions to the top three scoring teams, based on the sum of the three highest scores from each school in each division.

There were 40 participants in the Mechanics Division. This year's individual awardees are:

- 2<sup>nd</sup> Place – Megan Distler – Helias High School
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Place – Danny Feldmann – Helias High School

Team awards for the Mechanics Division are:

- 3<sup>rd</sup> Place – Webster Groves High School

Honorable Mention awards were given to Ian McGhee of Westminster Christian Academy, and to Ali Sehizadeh and Josh Few of Clayton High School.

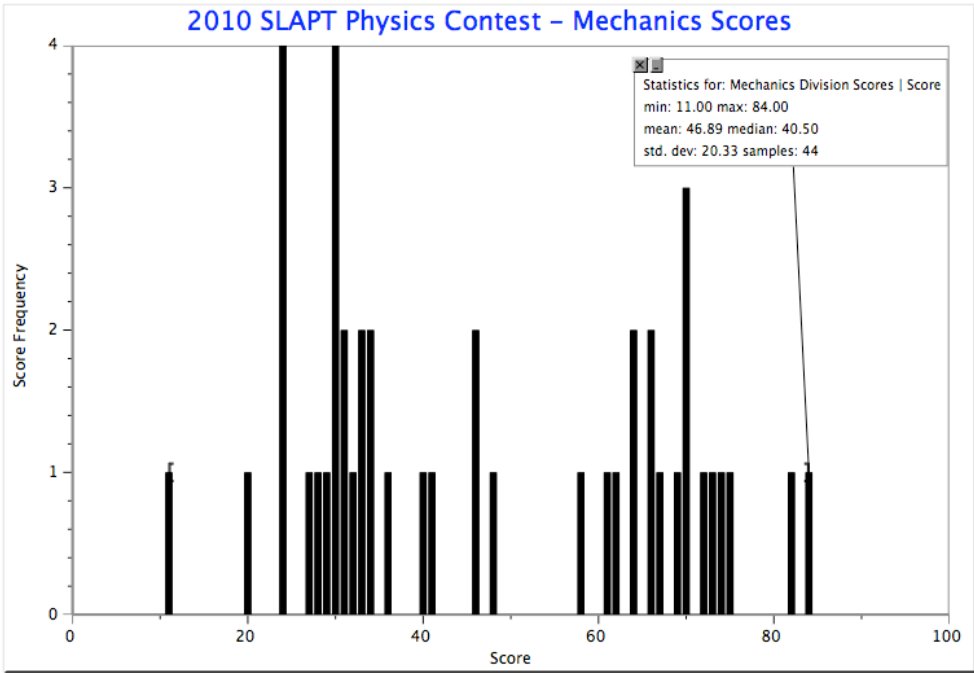
Team awards for the Senior Division are:
